



English 5th Level 2017- 2018

Level and objectives

The 5th level at the Escoles Oficials d'Idiomes, which you are about to begin, is a general language course referenced to the B2 level (independent user) of the Council of Europe. It consists of a minimum of 130 teaching hours including counselling sessions and cultural activities. Its main aim is to allow students to achieve these objectives:

Oral interaction & expression	Written interaction & expression
 Interact with a degree of fluency and spontaneity that makes regular interaction with natives speakers quite possible and take an active part in discussions in familiar contexts. Present clear, detailed descriptions on a wide range of subjects related to their fields of interest. Explain a viewpoint on an issue giving the advantages and disadvantages of various options. 	 Write clear detailed texts in different registers on a wide range of subjects related to their interests. Write texts passing on information or giving reasons in support of or against a particular point of view. Write letters highlighting the personal significance of events and experiences.

 Understand extended speech and lectures and follow even complex lines of argument when the topic is reasonably familiar. Understand most TV news and current affairs programmes. Understand the most common varieties of standard English. 	 Read articles and reports concerned with contemporary problems in which the writers adopt particular attitudes or viewpoints. Understand contemporary literary prose.

Assessment and attendance

In 5th level students will have to sit the *Certificat de Nivell Avançat* (B2) exam. However, there will also be continuous assessment during the course.

The assessment tools used will be:

- tests that will assess different skills and contents worked on in class (reading, listening, lexis and grammar competence) either formally or informally. There will also be a mock exam in order to familiarize students with the format of the certificate exam.
- informal oral testing in the classroom may include discussions. An oral mock exam will also take place.
- writing tasks done at home or in class from which both students and teachers will get an
 insight of the students' writing progress and process.
- other tasks that the teachers may consider convenient

To pass the course and obtain the *Certificat de Nivell Avançat*, students need an average mark of 65% or higher in the final exam. For more information about the exam, visit the following web page: https://goo.gl/rFVGQK

Classes will last 2.15 hours. Additionally, in order to reach the required minimum 130 teaching hours established by the curriculum, 15-minute scheduled sessions will take place throughout the academic year. Mon-Wed groups will have 26 sessions and Tue-Thu groups will have 27. These sessions will comprise the following learning activities:

- 1. Speaking practice, related to both unit topics and exam preparation.
- 2. Individual or group counselling sessions aimed at dealing with the learning process.
